

## Irregular Verbs Rules

This volume presents an in-depth study of the so-called irregular Past Tense (sing/sang) and Noun Plural (foot/feet) forms with Internal Vowel Alternation (IVA) in English demonstrating that they possess both a fixed phonological and semantic regularity. The innovative sign-oriented analysis and inductive methodology employed in this study are further supported by additional first language acquisition data, experimental studies and historical evidence. The data culled from multiple linguistic anthologies, dictionaries and thesauri have shown that although the IVA process comprises a relatively small number of nominal and verbal forms in Modern English, IVA, originally, was a prevalent and productive process in Old English, Indo-European and other language families. The results of this empirical study present and introduce a novel classification based on the regular and systematic iconic-phonological and semantic nature of all these diverse IVA processes both nominal and verbal that has been maintained throughout the history of English.

Next, since the object of study of linguistics is language, the nine design features of language are employed to examine each of the objects as it pertains to African languages. After that, mathematical ideas of sustainability and those of tipping points are suggested as means to help Africa's development efforts.

When the Regular Verbs have been thoroughly mastered, the Irregular Verbs present no difficulty. All that need be learnt is the irregularities of important Verbs, which are indicated by thick type. No English for the Subjunctive Mood should be learned. The translation usually given, - "that I may speak," or "might speak," is most misleading, and often absolutely wrong. The only safe way is to learn when to employ this Mood. We omit que before the French Subjunctive, as it is no part of this Mood, and neither always precedes it nor always governs it. It is advisable, however, to insert it in replies to examination questions. Fuller conjugations of the Compound Tenses, and of the Negative and Interrogative Forms, are omitted, as they require no

learning whatever. The mere sight of these as given in most Grammars appals and disheartens the Student; and the formation is precisely the same throughout every Verb in the language. For the same reason, we give no list of the Verbs requiring "de" before a following Infinitive. There is no occasion to learn these Verbs, if it is borne in mind that all Verbs require "de" unless given in our Lists of those requiring "a," or no Preposition. We believe that this work will be found a great help to the beginner who has not yet mastered the Verbs, and an invaluable book of reference for the advanced Student.
